1457th ENGINEER BATTALION

Organized and Federally recognized 1 May 1939 in the Utah National Guard at Springville as Company A, 115th Engineer Regiment, an element of the 40th Division (later redesignated as the 40th Infantry Division)

Inducted into Federal service 3 March 1941 at Springville

Reorganized and redesignated 5 February 1942 as Company A, 115th Engineer Battalion

Redesignated 12 October 1943 as Company A, 115th Engineer Combat Battalion

Inactivated 7 April 1946 at Camp Stoneman, California

Expanded and redesignated 25 June 1946 as the 1457th Engineer Combat Battalion and relieved from assignment to the 40th Infantry Division

Organized and Federally recognized 31 January 1949 with Headquarters at American Fork

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1953 as the 1457th Engineer Battalion
